

## TEAM FROM ICT GOES FOR BIOMETRIC TRAINING AT IDEMIA OFFICE, SANDTON, SOUTH AFRICA

The ICT Center BSRIS implementation team attended a Biometric training in Sandton, South Africa on February 25th to March 2nd 2018. The training covered various aspects of Biometrics technology which when set up will enhance the Biometric Student Registration and Identification system (BSRIS) currently implemented throughout the University.

Led by the Deputy Director (MIS), Mr. Paul Kariuki, the team was hosted by Idemia (formerly Safran Morpho) at their Sandton, South Africa offices. The team was taken through Biometric technology, specifically the secure capture and transmission of electronic fingerprints for student registration and verification purposes. In addition they were also trained on Access Control devices available and trained on how to set them up for use and how to analyze the data captured during the enrollment process. The solutions the team was trained on were specifically designed to control physical access to secure University premises and they encompassed **fingerprint, multimodal vein and print, facial recognition** and **contactless** technologies. These Biometric terminals add security to a variety of processes and the University of Nairobi is keen on enhancing security throughout its facilities.
